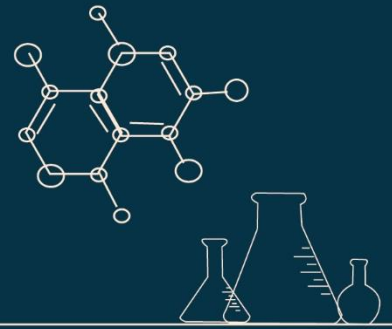


101 College Street Community Scholarship

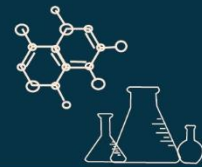


Thank you for your interest in the 101 College Street Community Scholarship! This scholarship was made possible by a collaboration between the City of New Haven and developer Carter Winstanley as part of the agreement to build 101 College Street, a bioscience research and lab facility that is in construction and scheduled to be completed in late 2023.

The City of New Haven is striving to provide New Haven residents access to well-paying, meaningful careers in the biosciences. Statewide, there are over 23,000 jobs in biomedical research and development, with substantial future growth concentrated right here in New Haven. We are committed to creating a workforce that reflects the New Haven community.

New Haven's Hill, Dwight, and Downtown neighborhoods are the focus of this scholarship as these were the areas cut off from each other by the construction of the Route 34 highway during Urban Renewal. Downtown Crossing is a project to take out the Route 34 highway and restore these connections with new city streets that include bicycle and pedestrian-friendly infrastructure. The land which was previously used for the highway or parking lots is also now being reimagined with new buildings like 101 College Street that are home to some of the world's cutting-edge research and development companies.



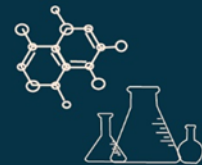


Applicants to the 101 College Street Community Scholarship must:

- Currently reside in New Haven's Hill, Downtown, or Dwight neighborhoods; **and**
- Currently be enrolled at Southern Connecticut State University or at Gateway Community College and pursuing bioscience-related coursework; **or**
- Be a high school senior, high-school graduate, or GED recipient who plans to enroll at Southern Connecticut State University or at Gateway Community College and pursue bioscience-related coursework; **or**
- Adult members of New Haven Works who are pursuing, or intend to pursue, bioscience-related coursework at Southern Connecticut State University or at Gateway Community College.

To apply for the 101 College Street Community Scholarship, you will need to:

- Fill out this application.
- Submit an essay that describes your career and/or academic goals. What have you done to achieve these goals? What are your plans to continue to work towards achieving your goals in the future? The essay should be between 1,000-1,500 words.
- Submit high school or college transcripts or a GED certificate, as applicable.
- Present proof of membership to New Haven Works, as applicable.
